Exodus 20

Today is our final Sunday on the theme of the 10 Commandments. Each week we've tried to show how the commandments are part of a bigger story seen in the picture boxes below. Here's a very brief summary!

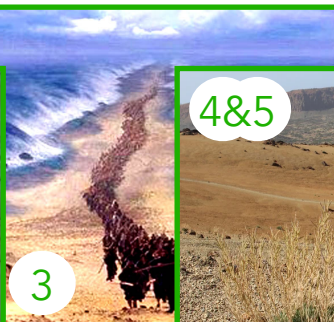
1. The Israelites were slaves in Egypt.
2. Whilst still in Egypt, the families were spared from death by the blood of the Passover lamb being put on their doorposts.
3. God's supernatural power opened up the Red Sea and gave them a way to a new life of freedom from slavery.
4. Whilst in the desert he gave the 10 Commandments. These didn't save the people from slavery, but rather showed them a new way to live.
5. God used the desert to test and train the Israelites. Sadly many of them disobeyed him and died there.
6. Moses saw the Promised Land but never entered into it. The task of leading the people into the land was given to Joshua.

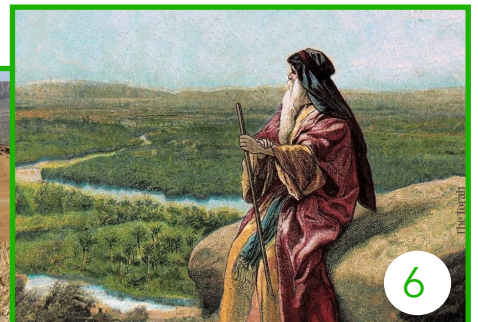

For us today, this story becomes a picture of dying to sin and rising to a new life in Jesus Christ. It's by his blood we're saved, but we're called to walk in obedience to him in the 'promised land' of the Christian life (see 1Cor 10).

Exodus 20:1-2 & 16-17

1 And God spoke all these words:
2 "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery."

16 "You shall not give false testimony against your neighbour."

17 "You shall not covet your neighbour's house. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or his male or female servant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbour."

Deuteronomy 34:1-12

1 Then Moses climbed Mount Nebo from the plains of Moab to the top of Pisgah, opposite Jericho. There the Lord showed him the whole land – from Gilead to Dan, 2 all of Naphtali, the territory of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Mediterranean Sea, 3 the Negev and the whole region from the Valley of Jericho, the City of Palms, as far as Zoar.

4 Then the Lord said to him, 'This is the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob when I said, "I will give it to your descendants." I have let you see it with your eyes, but you will not cross over into it.'

5 And Moses the servant of the Lord died there in Moab, as the Lord had said. 6 He buried him in Moab, in the valley opposite Beth Peor, but to this day no one knows where his grave is. 7 Moses was a hundred and twenty years old when he died, yet his eyes were not weak nor his strength gone. 8 The Israelites grieved for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days, until the time of weeping and mourning was over.

9 Now Joshua son of Nun was filled with the spirit of wisdom because Moses had laid his hands on him. So the Israelites listened to him and did what the Lord had commanded Moses.

John 10:7-10

7 Therefore Jesus said again, 'Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. 8 All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. 9 I am the gate; whoever enters through

me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. 10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.
