Isaiah 7:14b

"The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel."

A Collect for the 4th Week of Advent

Eternal God, as Mary waited for the birth of your Son, so we wait for his coming in glory; bring us through the birth pangs of this present age to see, with her, our great salvation in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Isaiah 7:10-16

10 Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, 11 'Ask the Lord your God for a sign, whether in the deepest depths or in the highest heights.'

12 But Ahaz said, 'I will not ask; I will not put the Lord to the test.'

13 Then Isaiah said, 'Hear now, you house of David! Is it not enough to try the patience of humans? Will you try the patience of my God also?

14 Therefore the Lord himself will give

you a sign: the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. 15 He will be eating curds and honey when he knows enough to reject the wrong and choose the right, 16 for before the boy knows enough to reject the wrong and choose the right, the land of the two kings you dread will be laid waste."

Matthew 1:18-25

18 This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: his mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit.

19 Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce

20 But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy

Spirit. 21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.'

22 All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had said through the prophet:
23 'The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel' (which means 'God with us').

24 When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. 25 But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

Psalm 42:1

- Or is your/our appetite being filled with other things?

Colossians 3:13-15

"Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity. Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful."

- Do you/we love Christ's body, his Church? Is there any bitterness?
- Do you/we have a grateful heart?

Acts 2:42

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer."

- Are you/we devoted to things of God?
- # If not, what might be preventing you/us from being fully committed?

1Thessalonians 2:13

"And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is indeed at work in you who believe."

- # Are you/we **thankful** for the Word of God and its work in your/our life?
- Or are there parts of it that you/we resist?

As you look ahead to 2026, what areas in your own relationship with the Lord might you pay special attention to?

Suggestions might include: Forgiving others; sharing your faith; encouraging others; being thankful; Bible reading; fasting; praying; commitment to fellowship; loving those you struggle with; generosity.
