


News and Information in the Life of Eastleigh Parish Church

This weekend will see us taking a look at the 2nd of the 7 letters to the churches in Revelation. *What did you find most striking about the letter to Ephesus that we read together last week?* Here's a few reminders of some key points from that letter:

- All the 7 churches are held by Jesus and he holds them securely.
- When Jesus says he sees all that we think and do, he does so not as a 'super spy' trying to catch us out, but according to his nature which is "compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love." (Psalm 103:8)
- The love that the Ephesian Church had forsaken (i.e. 'forsaken' left behind, like a brolly at home) was not a feeling or emotional type of love. It is 'agapé love' - which is described in detail in 1Corinthians 13. It was this active, choosing, love that they had forsaken.
- There are some things that Jesus hates, and that he applauds his disciples for hating too. Jesus really does love sinners (like you and me). Jesus really does hate certain sins.
- Jesus offers the most incredible rewards, but only for those who choose him and his way of life now.

As we continue on through these 7 letters, here's a reminder of **2 helpful questions that** might stimulate your thinking:

- 1. Which of the 7 letters might best describe the Church in Eastleigh?
- 2. Of all the challenges Jesus gives to the 7 Churches in Revelation, what might you individually need to particularly respond to?

increasingly-long time of tea, coffee & catch-up. If you can, why not come and join us?



Revelation 2:8-11

8 'To the angel of the church in Smyrna write:

These are the words of him who is the First and the Last, who died and came to life again. **9** I know your afflictions and your poverty – yet you are rich! I know about the slander of those who say they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan. **10** Do not be afraid of what you are about to suffer. I tell you, the devil will put some of you in prison to test you, and you will suffer persecution for ten days. Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you life as your victor's crown.

11 Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. The one who is victorious will not be hurt at all by the second death.

Luke 4:14-21

14 Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through the whole countryside. 15 He was teaching in their synagogues, and everyone praised him.

16 He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, 17 and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written:

18 'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me

to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners

and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free,

19 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.'

20 Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. 21 He began by saying to them, 'Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.'
